## **Denial Criteria for Hanscom Air Force Base**

- 1. U.S. citizenship, immigration status, or SSN cannot be verified; claimed identity cannot be verified.
- 2. Wanted by federal or civil law enforcement authorities, regardless of offense/violation.
- 3. Known to be or reasonably suspected of being a terrorist, or belongs to an organization with known terrorism links/support.
- 4. Has knowingly and willfully engaged in acts or activities designed to overthrow the U.S. Government by force.
- 5. Appears on any federal or state agency's watch list or hit list for criminal behavior or terrorist activity.
- 6. Conviction of a firearms or explosive violation within the past THREE (3) years.
- 7. Incarceration for 12 months or longer within the past THREE (3) years, regardless of the offense/violation.
- 8. Any conviction for espionage, sabotage, treason, terrorism, or murder.
- 9. Any conviction for sexual assault, armed assault/robbery, rape, child molestation, trafficking in humans, drug possession with intent to sell, drug distribution, or drug trafficking within the past TEN (10) years.
- 10. Any conviction of illegal possession or use of drugs/narcotics on more than one occasion within the past FIVE (5) years.
- 11. Any conviction of a felony involving violence against a person, arson, robbery, or burglary within the past TEN (10) years.
- 12. Any conviction of any crime involving indecent acts with a minor (to include any crime related to child pornography), or a felony that is sexual in nature, within in the past TEN (10) years.
- 13. Conspiracy to commit any of the above offenses.
- 14. Any OPEN case, pending final adjudication, where the individual has been arrested of any of the above listed offenses, to include any drug-related case showing an OPEN status.
- 15. Registration as a sex offender.
- 16. Any immigration violations.
- 17. Conspiracy to commit any of the above.

Disclaimer: This is not an all-inclusive list. Historical patterns of behavior that have the potential of interfering with security may result in denial. Refusal to submit to the background check will result in denial of access. The DFC will determine fitness accordingly on a case-by-case basis.
